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1. From the CEO's Desk

The Hon'ble Supreme Court observed "the foundation of healthy democracy is to have well informed citizens - voters". The highest judiciary body very aptly remarked " a little man - a citizen- a voter is the master of his vote ". In this context the role of healthy elections viz-a-viz the informed citizens becomes all the more imperative. The Election Commission of India (ECI) is duty-bound not only to conduct elections; but to conduct elections in an inclusive manner. This requires, initially the inclusion of each and every eligible elector in the voter list and subsequently, active participation on the poll day in the form of casting vote. This is where the need for voter awareness arises. The systematic voters' education and electoral participation (SVEEP) was started by the ECI for this purpose in December 2009.

The first two phases of SVEEP, i.e., SVEEP-I and SVEEP-II have been quite successful in enhancing both voter registration and voter turnouts in Rajasthan as is reflected in the enhanced electoral rolls' health and voter turnout figures. *Resorting to unexplored new avenues in light of the extra ordinary pandemic times, online registration was explored as the pivotal modus operandi. While during the last Summary revision 15% of the total forms were received online, this figure touched an all new 65% forms that were received online. Active usage of ELCs, various SVEEP initiatives as per the pandemic requirements and enhanced exposure and use of digital platforms played a decisive role in this.*

The motto of the plan is the ECI slogan that "*No Voter to be Left Behind.*". Accessible elections being the core thrust area, we ensured convergence of ideas from all the stakeholders and the concerning departments and CSOs to execute pin-pointed efforts in order to achieve the utopian ideal of maximum registration and inclusion of the still excluded population segments like the Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) in the electoral mainstream. This segment is being enrolled on a priority basis in the Rolls revision. During the SSR, 2021 we were able to add approx 7000 PwD as new voters. ELCs played a decisive role whether *chunav pathshalas/VAF/School/College level*. As of today, Rajasthan has a total of 40887 registered ELCs Our efforts have borne fruits and we are slowly and steadily



achieving the dream of inclusive participation, the sine qua non for a truly participatory democracy in the country.

The SVEEP activities executed during the recent bye-elections were fine-tuned after due deliberation as to the pragmatic approach and challenges faced during past rollouts of SVEEP programme in the State at the District, AC and Polling Station level. The bye-election plan was tailor-cut to the needs of respective ACs and was worked out at intensive and extensive levels for district, assembly constituency & booth level.

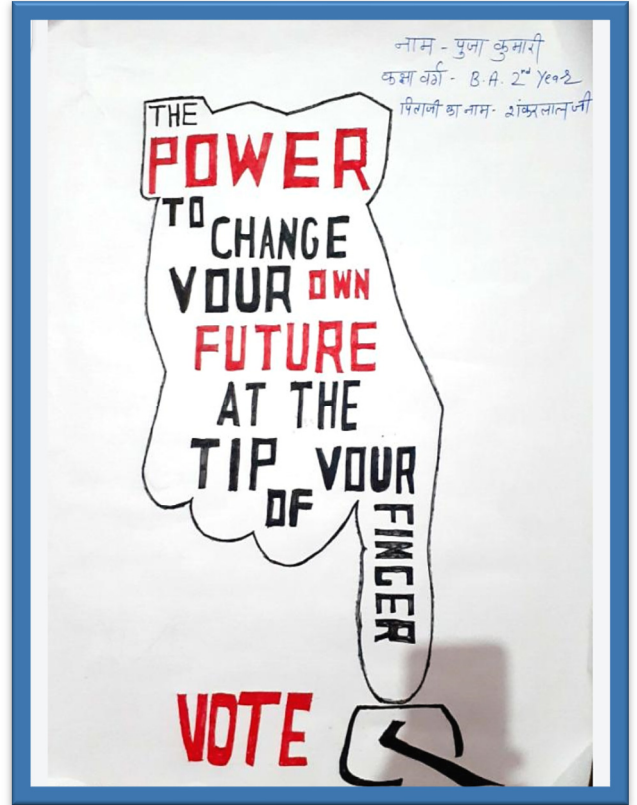


2. State SVEEP Mission

2.1. SVEEP Mission

In light of the SVEEP Mission plan outline formulated by the ECI, the state mission known as "VISION 6."

2.	Free and fair elections
3.	Voter-centric activities.
4.	Inclusive electoral participation.
5.	Total electoral participation. Which Involves: 1) To register as voters 2) To cast vote in elections 3) To cast vote ethically. 4) To motivate others for the same.
6.	Continuous Electoral and democratic education.



2.2. Strategy for SVEEP

The State has adopted a *three tier strategy* for planning and implementation of SVEEP activities:-

State level

- Environment building strategy.

District level

- Bridging the gap strategy.

Polling station level

- Micro planning strategy.

3. SVEEP in COVID-19 Pandemic- a paradigm shift

3.1. SVEEP in COVID-19 Pandemic

The execution of SVEEP posed a real challenge in view of the impending dangers looming due to the Corona Pandemic. Adopting a crisp crisis management strategy customised as per the need of the hour, the CEO Rajasthan seamlessly incorporated & explored new innovative ways to expand its outreach. The Corona times propelled us to explore the new frontiers and avenues of working. As per ECI directions, **SVEEP Core Committee** has been constituted at CEO level and public health expert included in it.



In view of the Covid-19 Pandemic, and it being the Digital Era, the SVEEP Plan hinges on digital content, online procedures and SM (Social Media) –based delivery system.

3.2. Thrust Areas

Youth

In order to tap the vibrant young new voters and address the perennial issue of urban apathy, unexplored frontiers were used on an aggressive spree. "India is bubbling with youth vigour", clearly validated by the statistics that more than 65 percent of the current population in India is below 35 years of age, the average age of an Indian citizen being 27 years. Hence, youth engagement in election is an essential



prerequisite for a robust democracy marked by increased electoral participation.

The population of the State of Rajasthan also reflects the preponderance of the youth. In it, the 18-19 Age Cohort is vital to the success of any voter-registration drive, because of its being constituted of the freshly turned 18+ age individuals. The population of Rajasthan belonging to the 18-19 Age Cohort is 4.23 % (as per the 2011 Census). For this target group, following initiatives were taken-

- Cluster Enrollment Camps organized in communion with Directors, Higher and Technical Education and RSLDC.
- For new voters' online admission form in colleges incorporated the popup link for NVSP portal for those who had still not registered as Voters. Thus, a total of approximately 3.5 Lac college students visited the NVSP Portal.
- During SSR a total of **10,61,303** forms were added and after deletion a total of **7,05,597** new electors were added in the final publication on 18-01-2021. Online Registration was encouraged to the hilt. While during the last Summary revision **15%** of the total forms were received online, this figure touched an all new 65% forms that were received online. Active usage of ELCs, various SVEEP initiatives as per the pandemic requirements and enhanced exposure and use of digital platforms played a decisive role in this.
- Social media usage was actively & aggressively pursued, with a visible shoot-up in number of followers & posts followed on various digital platforms- Facebook, Twitter, Instagram. CEO Office and DEO Offices are coming up on Social Media Platforms and posting content related to best SVEEP Practices undertaken at their level.
- Dialogues were established through series of



webinars with the ELC Nodal Officers in School & College education. A momentum was built up as all these field functionaries gained insight into their role and expectations for enhanced registration. The extent of webinars covered the latest innovations of ECI **e-EPIC and Hello Voters - web radio** among others like PwD, AMF, Voter Portal, 1950, EVM- VVPAT, Postal Ballot.

- ELCs worked as the linchpin for spreading electoral awareness in the field. Resultantly, they were harnessed for Cluster Enrolment Camps. They worked as an effective tool for SVEEP Nodal Officers who were appointed for PwD and ELC (School & College).
- Campus Ambassador were roped in for maximum coverage and to promote local connect of the people.
- Lead ELCs served as the mentor and lighthouse for all other ELCs in the vicinity. Lead ELC was constituted in every district and block.
- Presently, **40,887 ELCs** working as the linchpin for removing the bottlenecks.
- Voter Friends (Matdata Mitra), Volunteers of NSS, NCC, NYK, Bharat Scout and Guide, Youth clubs formed essential work force to target maximum registration of this segment of voters.
- An environment building strategy was followed wherein a poster-making and slogan writing competition was held online for school and college education.



Persons with Disabilities

- With the Accessible elections as core area of thrust, we are aiming ambitiously to achieve 100% registration of people with Disability (PwD) in the electoral rolls. We intend to aim for accessible election in the true holistic spirit and achieve the goal of 100% registration of 18+ electors in the PwD segment.
- The State's comprehensive SVEEP plan encapsulated various activities for the PwD. In this regards data from the Disability Commission and the Department of Social Justice and Empowerment was collected and collated.
- This data was further mapped with the electoral rolls of Assembly Constituencies. Further this data was shared with all District Election Officers.
- As a part of Special Summary Revision of Electoral rolls, Districts Election Officers were directed to update this before Draft Publication date through Booth Level Officers. The PwD who were not registered were motivated to fill Form 6.
- The Social Justice & Empowerment Department was roped in as a valuable SVEEP stakeholder in this regard.
- The augmented usage of ELC in every relevant aspect for enhanced electoral awareness and increased online registration was also



focused upon. The BLOs were directed to contact the PwD electors on telephone, and if needed, in person also (while keeping Covid-19 in mind), to help them w.r.t. NVSP Portal, fill up forms etc.



- As a scale up measure, the CEO conducted meeting with various NGOs who are working in this field. After detailed deliberations with them and their precise target centered inputs, action plan was reframed to ensure increased registration of PwDs in the Voter list.

- As a part of SSR - 21, comprehensive Cluster Enrolment Drives were conducted across all the districts specifically for PwD. Thus, a total of 1953 PwDs were registered on a single day 12.12.2020 during this exclusive camp.

- NVSP Portal Training for organizations like DISHA, UMANG and also Government Divyang Centre, Jamdoli. The response was over whelming. These trainings were conducted both online and offline. A continuous dialogue was established with PwD Nodal officers and NSS Nodal officers to specifically address the needs of this segment of voters and orient them about AMF, Postal Ballot, PwD, Voter Portal, 1950. This resource work pool helped to disseminate information as well as mobilize various electoral awareness programmes in the field. Also Special Programmes in Army cantonment Areas were conducted to train the Nodal



Officers. In all these training, COVID guidelines were strictly adhered to and they were organised in small numbers.

- Both government and private NGOs like Umang, Disha, PUCLetc. Were associated for further inclusion of PwDs in Electoral Process and electoral literacy
- Plethora of IEC material, posters, graphics, hoardings, flex that were printed and displayed at various points across the state ensuring maximum visibility to the public.
- The data & detailed information (including mobile numbers) of the 7,22,170 plus 18+ Age PwDs in the State, received in total from the Disability Commissioner, Rajasthan and the State Social Justice & Empowerment Department (SJED), was made available down-the-line upto the BLO level Part-wise.
- The District level PwD Committee meeting was held on 14th September 2020. All the 130 identified PwD NGOs operating in the State, participated in the District PwD Committee meetings, and enriched the proceedings with their invaluable insights & feedback for the road ahead in pursuit of 100% accessible elections.
- The State Steering Committee on Accessible Elections was conducted on 22.06.2021. The members deliberated upon various facets of consolidation as



well as augmented usage of registration measures for PwDs. As a result of such consistent target-specific efforts, a total of 500024 PwD electors were flagged in all the districts.



3.2. Women

- This segment overlapped with the initiatives for PwD. Greater focus was placed on women belonging to BPL and PwDs.
- All Women Polling booths were setup during the bye election to provide ease of voting.
- Aanganwadi workers, SHGs, Aasha Sahyoginis, CSO groups, along with community and department partnership were forged.



- Online ELC competitions also witnessed a surge in female participants wherein they displayed the spirit of democracy through mehendi (henna) competition.
- Volunteers from NSS, NCC, NYK, Bharat Scout and guides along with campus ambassadors also promoted the cause of this segment of voters.

Apart from the above targeted interventions, region specific, penetrative SVEEP interventions through rigorous mechanism were adopted to ensure maximum outreach. Targeted interventions for specific groups like Geriatric, Centenarian, Essential Services, Women Electors, Tribals etc were executed in the state specifically with an eye on bye-polls that were scheduled to be conducted in state.



4. Other Measures

a) Identification of 25% such ACs with lowest VTR. Polling Stations and Micro-Planning



formulated incorporating customised and focussed SVEEP interventions

b) A hands-on training for NVSP portal was conducted in CEO office which was then organised in cascade form in all the districts. All Election Staff as well as all the Booth Level Officers (BLOs) have been imparted with the requisite know-how & training regarding the online voter registration process on the NVSP portal and the Voter Helpline App.

c) These trainings for NVSP Portal

facilitated spread of know - how about its modus operandi.

d) To sensitise & activate the public, circulation of Bulk Messages through mobile operators in the state one day prior to the special camps on 29-11-2020 & 06-12-2020. Adopting a penetrative approach, families were targeted through free bulk messages sent by the Department of Information Technology & Communication, Govt. of Rajasthan, thus hitting the psyche of people towards



their duty as a voter. Also private mobile service providers were also looped in for the task. A whopping total **4.56 Crore** Bulk Messages were sent by us. Similarly a total of **2.20 Lac** bulk SMS were sent for e-EPIC campaign on 6-7 March, 2021.

- e) Social media was the omniscient tool for road ahead. It was explored to the utmost.
- f) Two short films and six audio jingles that were aired across the channels- Doordarshan etc., thus igniting the voters' sensibilities.
- g) ELCs worked as the linchpin for spreading electoral awareness in the field. Resultantly, they were harnessed for Cluster Enrolment Camps. They worked as an effective tool for SVEEP Nodal Officers who were appointed for PwD and ELC (School & College).
- h) Plethora of IEC material, posters, graphics, hoardings, flex that were printed and displayed at various points across the state ensuring maximum visibility to the public.
- i) Various types of Online Platforms like Microsoft Team, Google Meet, Zoom, Webex adopted to provide online training to all our Stakeholders.
- j) For the convenience of the Citizens, we have also provided the Electoral Rolls of all 200-ACs of the State on the website of CEO Rajasthan.
- k) As a part of widespread publicity, the department explored new frontiers and articles were published in SUJAS, the official government journal released by DIPR. The articles were about NVD 2021 and effective role of ELCs in bye-election.
- l) Division-wise review periodically by the Divisional Commissioners (Roll Observers).
- m) Each Election official entrusted with the target of enrolling at least 5 Electors, while BLO would enroll at least 10 Electors.
- n) Replication of Innovative District-specific SVEEP interventions and models.

5. National Voters' Day - 2021

4.1. The Program Modalities

In view of the extra-ordinary pandemic times, alternate options were explored to the hilt. As per ECI directions the National Voters' Day, 2021 was organized with full gusto and fervor, albeit on virtual mode.

Hon'ble Governor, Rajasthan Shri Kalraj Mishra was the Chief Guest who participated from the Raj Bhawan. He administered the Preamble & the Fundamental Duties to all thus reminding every citizen the concurrent value of rights and responsibilities. The programme was



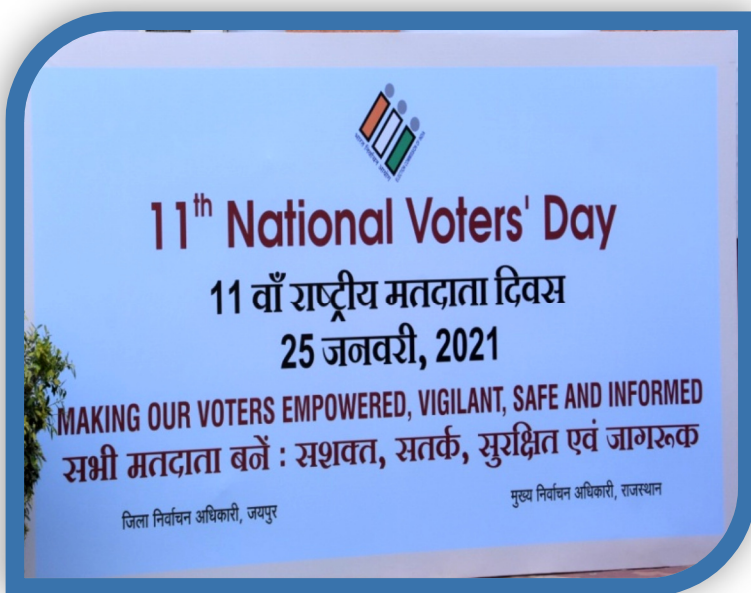
started on a solemn note with the singing of National Anthem that is the hallmark of every proud Indian National.

This was followed by the introductory remarks by the CEO wherein he apprised that the programme is being organised at State, District and every AC level.

Other dignitaries i.e. Shri P. S. Mehra, State Election Commissioner, Rajasthan, Shri Niranjana Arya, Chief Secretary, Rajasthan were the guests of

honour and the programme was attended by other officers of the department.

The message of the CEC was then aired as he heralded the beginning of a new decade that is full of hope, healing, recovery & faith. He stressed upon the **theme of this year NVD**



which is to make our Voters SIVE - Safe, Informed, Vigilant & Empowered. The CEC reiterated the reciprocal faith and trust of ECI and the Voters which was perceptible in the recent Bihar elections where even the Corona Pandemic could not deter the spirit of voters.

He lauded the stakeholders for successful conduct of elections even during such unprecedented times and also appealed to the voters of four more states & UT where elections are round the corner.

The remarkable initiative of e-EPIC & Hello Voters, the first of its kind was also stressed upon as the emerging nerve center of voter awareness & information sharing.

The Hon'ble Governor launched the Thematic Poster of NVD and administered the pledge to all.

The new Voters also marked their presence with short awareness video clippings and their belief in the Spirit of democracy.

The Chief Secretary, Sh. Niranjana Arya & State Election Commissioner Sh. P.S. Mehra also addressed the gathering. The SEC categorically appreciated the efforts done by the Election Department during SSR-21. The short video clipping of ECI on e-EPIC was also aired on the occasion.

Outstanding achievers in various districts were appreciated & recognised for their efforts and were awarded for their distinguished services. These included the DEOs, ADEOs, EROs, Supervisors & BLO's with even a special category of awardees. The Programme culminated with the address by Hon'ble Governor & Vote of Thanks by the District Election Officers, Jaipur.



The State level function was then followed in succession by the various district level programmes.

The programme was a resounding success with special words of appreciation from Hon'ble Governor for its meticulous and flawless planning as well as execution.

The programme was given extensive coverage through print and electronic media coupled with the social media which publicised the e-EPIC and Hello Radio initiative far & wide. Snapshots of same are enclosed herewith pictures.

6. Bye-Election - 2021

5.1. An overview of Bye-Election

Rajasthan witnessed a peaceful polling in 1145 polling stations spread across the three Assembly Constituencies in Sahara (Bhilwara), Rajsamand (Rajsamand) and Sujangarh (Churu).

In the run-up to the bye-polls that were held on 17th April, 2021 intensive SVEEP activities were conducted. The SVEEP plans received from the three districts were thoroughly reviewed and analyzed. Further, on the basis of these plans, a mini SVEEP bye-election plan was prepared which was precisely tailor-cut to the needs of particular AC while addressing the booth-specific strategy too. In order to mobilise maximum voters into them in stream and sensitize them

towards their duty as an informed and aware voter, a slew of activities were organized by the SVEEP cell. The modalities of this action plan were implemented on a weekly basis and real time information was garnered on a Google Drive link so as to review the implementation.



5.2. How we walked concrete in CORONA (SVEEP During Pandemic)

SVEEP amid COVID-19, The onset of the pandemic COVID-19 has forced a paradigm shift in working modes in various walks of life. Election has been no exception. Since last year in view of COVID-19, all activities including SSR and NVD have been conducted as per prescribed guidelines.

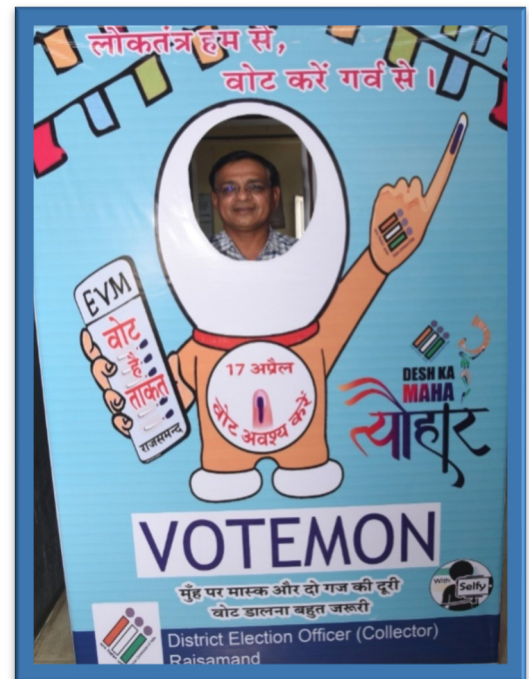
The major tenets of action plan were executed as per the following main go-aheads-

5.3. Information Dissemination

- Massive awareness drive was conducted to disseminate COVID-19 safety guidelines in the field by DEOs and ROs.
- Voter Guide along with other relevant IEC material was widely circulated through every possible platform- whatsapp groups, webinars, trainings, social media platforms, visits of BLO etc.
- As a mouthpiece for various initiatives and inventions of ECI i.e, e-EPIC, Hello Radio, Voters Helpline app, c-VIGIL, PwD, Postal Ballot, the SMV (SVEEP Mobile Vans) moved around the city to disseminate relevant information.



- Entire IEC material regarding EVM VVPAT awareness, NOTA and all ECI initiatives was circulated in the field through webinars, whatsapp groups that were formed individually for all the ACs going to polls. These groups served as an effective medium for environment building, bridging the gap and monitoring purposes.
- c-VIGIL awareness campaigns along with EVM-VVPAT awareness drive was organized on a war-footing.
- IEC material regarding the following was widely circulated-

- Adopting a penetrative approach, more and more families were targeted through free bulk SMS sent by DoIT.
- Similarly, BLOs were asked to constitute category wise whatsapp groups of voters at booth level which further helped to disseminate information to the voters at grass-root level.
- Whatsapp groups were constituted for every AC which served as an active platform for IEC material exchange between officers from the CEO office and DEO level. Also, these whatsapp groups helped in best practices sharing as there was continuous exchange of good activities in one AC being shared in another AC whatsapp group. Infact, it served as a great motivational pill for the concerning SVEEP officers in the districts.

5.4. Awareness Messages

Video messages of State icons (Devendra Jhajharia and Apoorvi Chandela) were prepared with special thrust on "Hello Voters". These messages were widely circulated among them as SMS with special focus to rope in the young voters. These helped to awaken the people towards their duty as an informed voter.

5.5. ELCs as the focal point

The Electoral Literacy Clubs were activated and mobilized which served as the Department's mouthpiece for widespread information dissemination as well as a perennial source of motivation at every level-school, college, community or organisation.

- As a part of ELC activities, Poster making competition along with essay and slogan writing competition was organized in schools and colleges.
- An online quiz competition on election modalities for gauging the Voter Quotient for college students as a part of environment building was conducted.
- Lead ELC in every district was intensely mobilized to serve as Resource center and Mentor to all the other ELC's in the district.
- More than 40887 ELC's have been registered in the state.



5.6. Going Digital - Social Media is the new Mantra-

The Social Media handles were aggressively utilized during this bye-election and its usage was unprecedented. Everyday updates were posted with precision and vision which lead to sharing of our posts by the ECI handles too. The social media handles of the Department on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram Youtube, Pinterest were regularly updated regarding various activities and awareness campaigns viz a viz c-VIGIL, e-EPIC, Voter Guide, PwD app, Voter Helpline app, Booth app, Hello Radio along with other activities that were conducted in all the three ACs. The Voter Guide was distributed and widely popularised through these social media handles and various other platforms too.

5.7. Ease of Voting-

- Arrangements were made for provision of Audio-Video guide for Hearing and visually impaired voters on Poll day.
- 1275 voter information slips in Braille were provided and 1255 Dummy ballot papers were filled up.
- The four mandatory posters - Braille, EVM VVPAT, PwD as recommended by ECI along with COVID posters were widely circulated. Information about Braille and voter slips was also disseminated through all mediums.
- Postal ballot proved to be a great success with PwDs and 80+ voters opting for it and the department has successfully and logistically executed it.
- At RO level, booths were identified for customized PwD needs. At all such booths, special volunteers from Scout/Guide were placed to help all PwD voters. Audio aids for the blind and visuals for deaf and dumb voters were fruitfully utilized for the same.

5.8. Corona Protocol

In view of the COVID-19 pandemic, all the activities were conducted strictly as per the prescribed guidelines of ECI adhering to corona protocol. In compliance of these guidelines, Social Distancing is the panacea for pandemic. Intense SVEEP Campaigns were conducted for over a month to create awareness about voting with social distancing. Massive sanitization drives were conducted one day prior to poll and facilities like thermal scanning, hand sanitizers, face masks were made available at the Polling Booths. All the social distancing guidelines were adhered to and BLOs along with Volunteers ensured effective monitoring of the same.

5.9. Interventions

- Interesting and innovative activities like the Snakes & Ladder game for election related modus operandi was conducted in the field.
- Eco-friendly Green Booths and women-centric Pink Booths were encouraged and promoted to be set up.
- Signature campaigns and pledge ceremonies were organized on a mass scale in all the three ACs.
- 25 % polling stations with lowest VTR were identified and booth-oriented target-centric activities were scheduled for these booths.

5.10. Online is the new Normal-

Keeping in view the pandemic times, the alternate modus operandi was harnessed to the hilt and webinars coupled with VCs were effectively channelized to impart training.

- A series of webinars with SVEEP officials of Sahara (Bhilwara), Rajsamand, Churu.
- Webinars on e-EPIC download and c-VIGIL.
- Webinars with ELC Nodal officers (School and College) and PwD Nodal officers.
- Webinar with NSS Nodal officers.
- VC for SCC and DCC.

Detailed Webinars were conducted with these field functionaries viz Nodal Officers for ELC (School/College), Nodal Officers for PwD and NSS. They were intensely oriented about e-EPIC, Hello Voter, PwD, AMF, Voter Portal, Voter Helpline App, 1950 helpline through these webinars and online meetings.

5.11. Monitoring & Review -

- The activities so conducted were regularly updated on Google Drive link that was shared by the CEO office with districts. Resultantly, we got real time information about these activities and the numbers were reviewed at CEO office level. A total of 167109 beneficiaries were recorded to have been oriented by the SVEEP activities in this Google Drive link.
- The CEO office explored every possible frontier to approach the masses and in this league even the CEO himself presented a talk on Aakashvaani on overall election modalities and voter awareness. A talk on MCC was held by the Additional CEO on Doordarshan.
- Crisp SVEEP strategy also incorporated Ratri Choupal, Door-to-Door campaign, meeting of BLOs, involvement of ELCs and Aanganwadi workers and Self-Help groups along with moilized usage of CSOs.

The SVEEP activities culminated with peaceful conduct of polling in three Assembly Constituencies of Sujangarh (Churu), Rajsamand and Sahara (Bhilwara). The Voting was held in 1145 polling stations across the three ACs.

There was an increase in number of polling stations due to an increase in auxiliary polling booths on account of reduction of voters from 1500 to 1000 per booth in adherence with COVID Social Distancing guidelines.

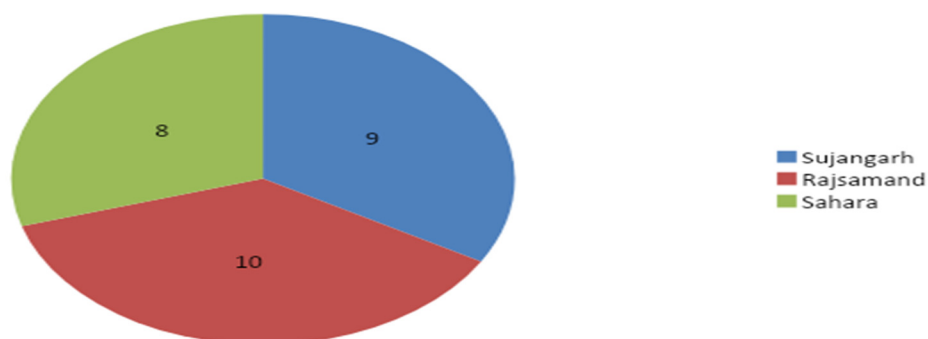

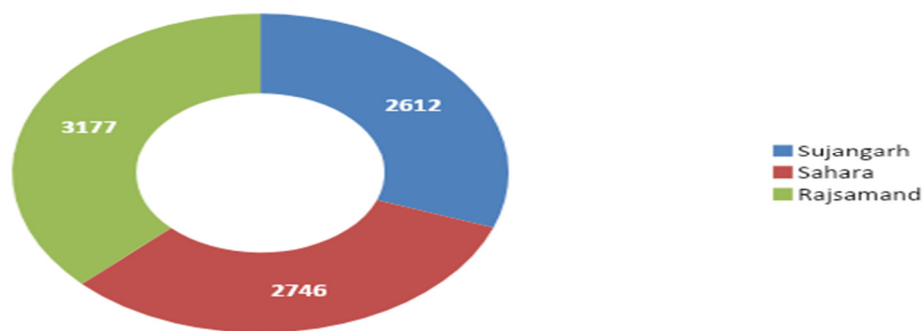

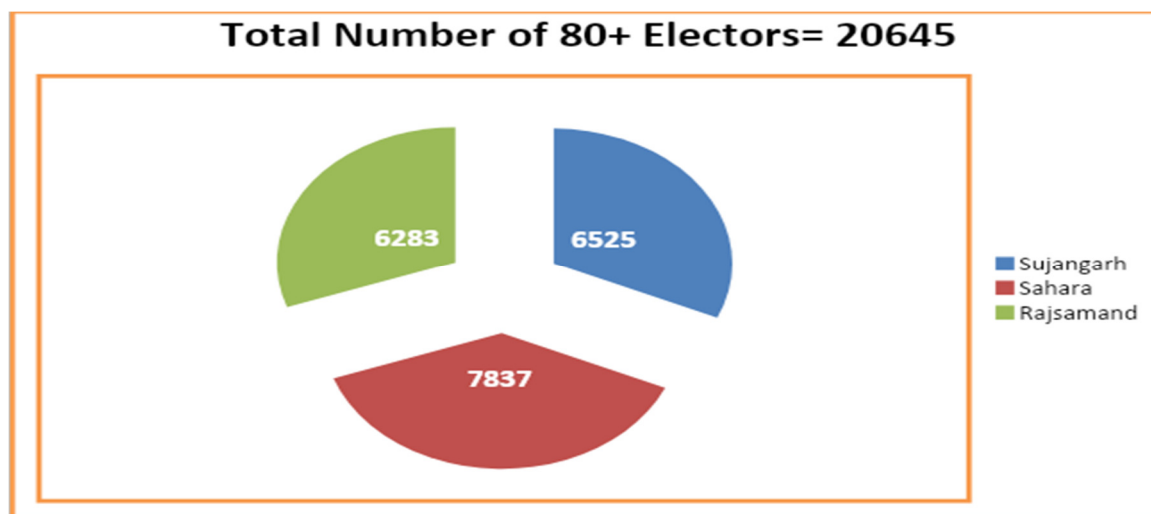

6.2. Postal Ballot-

With complete thrust on Inclusive & Accessible elections, the Postal Ballot facility has been extended by the ECI to PwD, Senior citizens of 80+ age and COVID-19 suspect or affected persons. For 80+ Voters, 753 Postal Ballots and for PwD Voters, 151 Postal Ballots were issued. Thus, a total of 904 Postal Ballots had been issued out of which 895 voted which sums up 745 for 80+ Voters and 150 for PwD Voters. The observers & DEOs ensured smooth facilitation of this service for these voters.



At every polling booth, AMF like drinking, water, waiting shed, toilet with water facility along with adequate light arrangements and suitable ramp were provided to

the voters. Voter Information Slip have been distributed to all the electors to facilitate ease of voting. Arrangements for the video guide for hearing and visually impaired voters on Poll day had been made. Public Address Systems were working to guide the blind and infirm voters who turned up at the booths. Also, Volunteers were placed at every Polling Booth to assist PwD and Senior Citizens. 925 Wheelchairs and 137 Vehicles were pressed into service for the physically disabled voters.

Following the standard protocol for EVM-VVPAT, First Level Checking, Randomization & Commissioning was done in presence of political parties/ candidates. Mock polls had been conducted earlier and the result of EVM & VVPAT slips were correlated for complete drill.

6.3. Monitoring Mechanism

As a hallmark of free & fair elections, live monitoring and webcasting of more than 10 % polling stations which also included critical & vulnerable polling booths, in compliance with ECI norms was done. It was a live streaming session wherein the CEO, DEOs, Observers could watch it & ensure a close watch on these specific polling booths. Various instructions for COVID compliance and resolution of poll related complaints were carried out with the use of Webcasting and Booth App technology.

The Expenditure Monitoring Teams led by 27 FST, 54 SST, 19 NAKAs, 6 VVT, 10 VST and 3 AT ensured to keep a vigil on any undue influence on fair and free voting. The Nodal departments like Police, Income Tax, Narcotics, Customs, Airports, Railways and banks had a major role to play.

A transparent & vigilant mechanism for COVID safe, intimidation free and inducement free elections amidst tight security arrangements was ensured. A total of 7275 CAPF, SAPF and police forces were deployed and route marches in vulnerable pockets, regular point patrolling and other confidence building measures were carried out to reassure voters especially those belonging to the weaker sections of the society. Wherever, any complaints of machine replacement or other related grievances were found, the CEO ensured quick redressal through technology besides the Sector officers and Police officials.

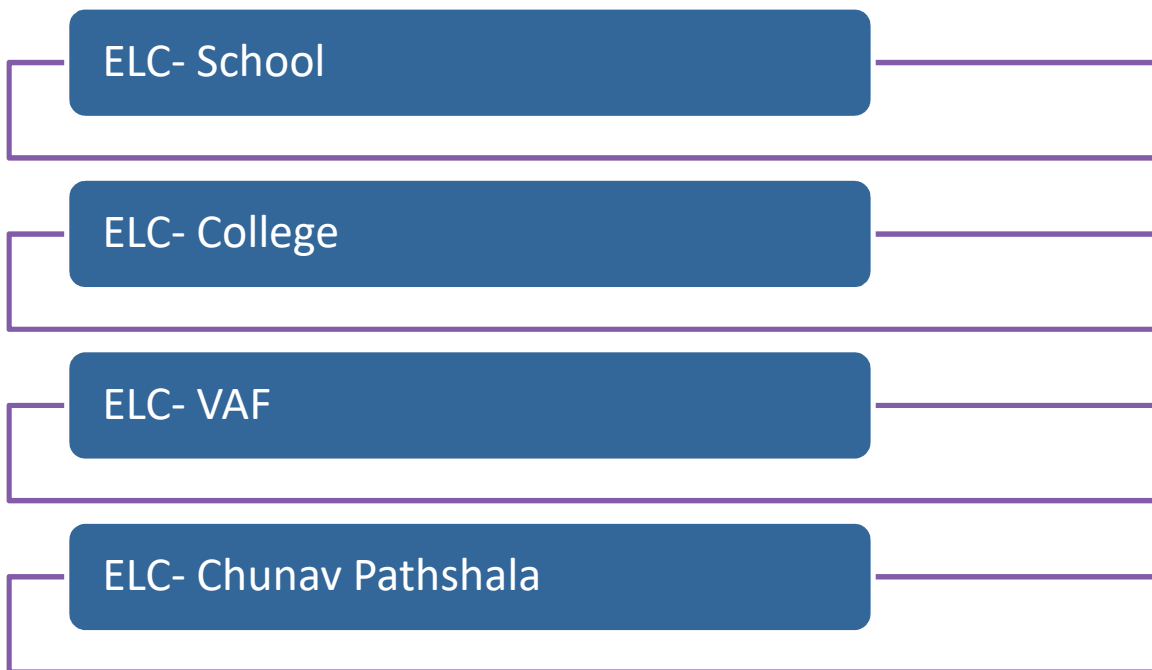
